RESPIRATORY TRACT SECRETIONS CORE CARE PLAN

Problem / Need:	Goal:

Interventions:

- 1. The Registered Nurse will undertake an assessment to identify physical, psychological and environmental causes of respiratory tract secretions.
- 2. All staff to ensure comfort measures are available, e.g. call bell, positional change.
- 3. Consider potential concerns of relatives / carers regarding noisy breathing. Explain, that although upsetting, this does not often distress the dying person.
- 4. Administer prescribed medication and consider non-pharmacological interventions, alongside regular assessment and review.
- 5. Document the presence of distressing respiratory tract secretions.
- 1. The Registered Nurse will supervise and support health and social care assistants / carers / relatives to assess, monitor and report to nursing staff if any problems with respiratory tract secretions.
- 2. Registered Nurse to liaise with Medical Practitioner and / or Specialist Palliative Care Team, if symptoms remain uncontrolled and side effects are problematic.
